What we expect from you as parents/carers

The family will:

- Ensure your child attends school on time, every day.
- Ensure your child is ready to learn by providing them with a healthy diet and proper rest.
- Send your child in the active uniform according to school policy.
- Support the school's high expectations on behaviour and positive attitudes to learning.
- Tell the school of any concerns or problems that might affect your child's work or behaviour.

- Read with their child at least three times a week.
- Engage in other activities sent home by school.
- Attend meetings with school staff to discuss your child, and fulfil any agreements made.
- Encourage your child to be independent and look after his/ her own things and school property.
- Inform the school promptly of any absences or health appointments during school hours.
- To ensure that contact details and emergency contact details are up to date.
